## THE FIRST EPISTLE OF JOHN.

THE STRUCTURE OF THE EPISTLE AS A WHOLE.

### NOTES.

- 1. WRITTEN BY the apostle John, as proved no less by its character than by external testimony. The similarity in tone and language to the Fourth Gospel shows both to be the work of that disciple whom Jesus loved (John 21:7).
- **2**. WRITTEN, as generally understood, to the "circle of Asiatic churches". But it is suggested that this First Epistle of John may be reckoned among the *Diaspora* and earlier epistles, for the following reasons:--
  - (a) The occurrences of the word parousia (2:28). See Matt. 24:3; 1 Thess. 2:19, &c.
  - (b) The significance of the possessive pronoun hemeteros (1:3; 2:2: see Notes), and
  - (c) Paul's statement that John was one of the "pillars", i.e. teachers of the Law, and therefore a minister of the circumcision (see Gal. 2:9).

The *position* that the epistle occupies canonically among the *Diaspora* writings strengthens the argument that it also is to be reckoned among them.

- 3. THE CONTENTS are practical teaching in the light of the love of God. God is Life, is Light, is Truth, is Righteous, is Love, and we have fellowship with Him through the Lord Jesus Christ by the Holy Spirit. "We know that He abideth in us by the spirit which He hath given us" (3:24). The apostle sets in vivid contrast the death, darkness, falsehood, hate, which are the characteristics of the devil who "sinneth from the beginning" (3:8), and those who are led by the spirit of error (4:6), with the work of the Holy Spirit in believers. But the dominant conception running throughout the epistle is that of the love which constraineth, as it constrained Paul (2 Cor. 5:14).
- **4**. WRITTEN FROM Ephesus according to tradition, but no definite statement can be made as to either place or time of writing. The character of the contents indicates a much earlier date than is usually supposed (see <u>Ap. 180</u>).

- 3 That which we have <sup>1</sup> seen and heard *report* we <sup>2</sup> to you, in order that ye also may have <sup>o</sup>fellowship with us: and truly our <sup>o</sup>fellowship is with the <sup>2</sup>Father, and with **H**is <sup>o</sup>**S**on <sup>⊙</sup>Jesus Christ.
- 4 And these things write we 2to you, 3in order that your joy may be *filled full*.
- **5** And this is the <sup>⊙</sup>message which we have heard from Him, and <sup>o</sup>declare <sup>2</sup>to you, that <sup>o</sup>God is <sup>o</sup>light, and in **H**im is <sup>o</sup>no darkness at all.
- **6** If we say that we have <sup>3</sup> fellowship with **H**im, and walk in darkness, we lie, and do not the <sup>⊙</sup>truth:
- 7 But if we walk in the <sup>5</sup>light, <sup>©</sup>as **He** [the Father] is in the <sup>5</sup>light, we have <sup>3</sup>fellowship *with one another*, and the blood of *Jesus* His <sup>3</sup>Son cleanseth us from all <sup>⊙</sup>sin.
- 8 If we say that we have **not** 7 sin, we deceive ourselves, and the <sup>6</sup>truth is not in us.
- **9** If we confess our <sup>7</sup>sins, **H**e is <sup>⊙</sup>faithful and <sup>⊙</sup>just *in order that He might* • forgive our <sup>7</sup> sins, and to cleanse us from all <sup>©</sup>unrighteousness.
- 10 If we say that we have not <sup>⊙</sup>sinned, we make Him a <sup>⊙</sup>liar, and **H**is <sup>⊙</sup>word is not in us.
- 2 My <sup>o</sup>little children, these things write I *to* you, *to the* end that ye may not commit sin habitually. And if any man *commit an act of sin*, we have an <sup>⊙</sup>advocate with the <sup>⊙</sup>Father, <sup>⊙</sup>Jesus Christ the <sup>⊙</sup>righteous:
- 2 And **H**e is the <sup>⊙</sup>propitiation for our <sup>⊙</sup>sins: and not for °ours only, but ... for the sins of the whole °world also.
- 3 And *in this* we do <sup>⊙</sup>know that we know **H**im, if we keep His commandments.
- 4 He that saith, "I 3know Him," and keepeth not His commandments, is a liar, and the <sup>⊙</sup>truth is not in him.
- 5 But whoso keepeth **H**is <sup>⊙</sup>word, in him verily is the <sup>⊙</sup>love of °God °perfected: 3*in this* 3know we that we are in **H**im.

- **15** ¹¹Love not the ²world, <sup>⊙</sup>neither the things *that are* in the <sup>2</sup>world. If any man <sup>10</sup>love the <sup>2</sup>world, the <sup>5</sup>love of the <sup>1</sup>Father is not in him.
- **16** For all that *is* in the <sup>2</sup>world, the lust of the flesh, and the lust of the eyes, and the <sup>o</sup>pride of <sup>o</sup>life, is not of the Father, but is of the <sup>2</sup>world.
- 17 And the <sup>2</sup>world <sup>8</sup>passeth away, and the lust thereof: but he that doeth the <sup>⊙</sup>will of <sup>5</sup>God <sup>6</sup>abideth <sup>⊙</sup>for ever.
- 18 <sup>13</sup>Little children, it is the *last hour* and as ye ... heard that oantichrist *cometh*, even now *have arisen* many oantichrists; whence we know that it is the last hour.
- 19 They went out from us, but they were not of us; for if they had been of us, they would *no doubt* have <sup>o</sup>continued with us: but they went out, in order that they might be •made manifest that they were not all of us.

- 3 And every man that hath this hope *fixed on* Him <sup>⊙</sup>purifieth himself, <sup>⊙</sup>even as **H**e is <sup>⊙</sup>pure.
